Course Description

Italian 193 is the fourth sequential course in the Italian curriculum and is designed for students who have completed the three previous ones. It is both a review and an expansion of Italian grammar and a deepening of conversational abilities. It emphasizes both the oral and the written language and, through the keeping of a journal, it encourages students to express themselves subjectively using both current and previously learned material.

Goals of the Course

As in all language courses, the ultimate goal is to learn to express oneself in another tongue. Additionally, students are expected, through readings both in the text and outside, to expand their cultural knowledge of things Italian. Since even at this point perfection is not demanded, students are encouraged to get adventurous with the language.

Organization of the Course

Italian 193 comprises several major and necessary components:

1. The Class Meetings

The class meetings will take place on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays and, barring extenuating circumstances, attendance is required. Attendance is necessary for two main reasons; satisfactory language acquisition takes place only by gradual and uninterrupted layering of linguistic knowledge; and everyone's contribution in class is expected and needed for a successful outcome.

2. Class time

Class time is used for answering students' and teacher's questions; for correcting prepared homework; and for the presentation of new material.

3. Homework

Once again, language acquisition takes place best when it is *constant* and *gradual*. Homework is assigned both in the textbook and in the workbook. Students are expected to complete all assignments in a timely fashion. In addition, students are asked to keep a weekly journal on a separate notebook. Such work will be corrected individually by the professor and returned. Within the limitations of time, the professor will go over each entry with each student.

4. Testing and Grading

Class participation and homework completion will factor in the final grade. Quizzes will be counted once in the computation of the final grade; chapter tests will be counted twice (that is to say, each test will have double the weight of a quiz). The final exam will be counted three times.
