Course Description:

This is the first of four courses designed to expand the student's ability and knowledge in music theory, sight-singing, ear training, keyboard skills, score reading and conducting.

Objectives:

By the end of the semester the students will be able and expected to

- Demonstrate knowledge of music notation
- Read and write in treble and bass clefs •
- Spell triads in all positions •
- Identify triads by sound and sight
- Write and identify by sound and sight different scales and key signatures •
- Sight-sing (Solfege) melodic exercises using movable "do"
- Sing and identify by sound and sight all intervals
- Perform rhythmic exercises including divisions of a single beat in simple and compound meters
- Accurately take rhythmic and melodic dictation using the above mentioned elements •
- Play I, IV, and V chord on piano in C, F, and G major (time permitting)
- Conduct 2, 3 and 4 patterns •
