COURSE DESCRIPTION:

Practice in all four skills: listening, speaking, writing, and reading will be given. Elements of language structure will be drilled and practiced in the classroom through oral and written exercises and <u>class participation</u>.

OBJECTIVES:

A basic aim of this course is to provide you with a sound basis for learning German as it is spoken and written today. You will be presented with opportunities to communicate in concrete situations in which you will actively use many of the basic structures of everyday conversation and writing, master the basic features of the sound and writing systems and utilize a basic vocabulary. This course will also introduce you to contemporary life and culture in the German speaking countries.
