Description

This is the first of four to five courses designed to expand the student's abilities in sight singing, ear training, keyboard skills, score reading and conducting.

Objectives

- ~Demonstrate knowledge of music notation.
- ~Read and write in treble and bass clefs.
- ~Spell triads in all positions.
- ~Identify the quality of triads by sound and sight.
- "Write and identify all major and minor scales and key signatures, including parallel and relative relationships.
 - ~Solfege major and minor melodies in movable do.
 - ~Sing and identify all intervals up to an octave.
- "Write and perform rhythm, including divisions of a single beat involving simple and compound meter.
 - ~Accurately take melodic dictation.
 - ~Play I, IV, and V chords on piano in C, F, and G major, both hands.
 - ~Conduct patterns in 2,3,4 and 5 (2 ways).
