Objectives – Students will be able to:

- 1. Write a lesson plan directed at elementary age students
- 2. Design lesson plans for instrumental lessons, choral groups, general music
- 3. Become familiar with available materials to be used in the above courses
- 4. Present lessons to the class in an effective manner
- 5. Indicate which elements of music are being addressed in each lesson
- 6. Indicate which national standards are being addressed in each lesson
- 7. Provide many ways to introduce and teach a concept
- 8. Explore methods of assessment
- 9. Explore classroom management and discipline situations and how to handle them
- 10. Develop motivational techniques
- 11. Develop ideas of how to make the lessons relevant to the student
- 12. Develop appropriate curriculum for age group and course
- 13. Become familiar with software to be used in conjunction with music classes at the elementary level
- 14. Explore methods of working with inclusion
- 15. Use Orff, Dalcroze, and Kodaly teaching methods to teach concept
- 16. Conduct small instrumental and vocal ensembles
- 17. Use the piano as a tool while teaching lessons

 Participation includes in-class work and being prepared for class discussions on assigned readings.

- 2. Lesson Plans
 - a. Rhythm lesson plan details will be given in class. 10% of final grade
 - b. Rote lesson plan details will be given in class. 10% of final grade
 - c. Unit of lessons You will create a unit of lessons (4 related lessons) on a topic. Complete details will be discussed in class. 20% of final grade
- 3. Fieldwork You will be assigned to a school placement for the completion of the 40 hour fieldwork requirement for this class. Students are required to attend prestudent teaching placements every week. Evaluation will include the assessment of the cooperating teacher and the college supervisor. The fieldwork grade will be based on your attendance, your work at that school, as well as the written records that you submit of that work. Additionally, students earning less than the required hours in the placement will lose 1/3 grade (A to A-) for each hour less than the 40 required hours. 20% of the final grade
- 4. Conference report You are expected to attend a day of the PMEA conference. Transportation arrangements will be discussed in class. You will submit critiques of 2 sessions. Details will be discussed in class. 10% of final grade
- 5. Exam A cumulative final written exam will be given. 20% of the final grade.
- 6. Other This category includes, but is not limited to: regular attendance in class, participation in class activities and discussions, playing the recorder, and assigned readings. 10% of final grade

<u>Piano, vocal, and guitar proficiencies</u> – Students need to work towards developing their piano, vocal, and guitar skills during the semester. Students must pass piano, vocal, and guitar proficiency exams during the fall semester prior to student teaching in order to student teach.
