COURSE POLICIES:

- A. No make-ups will ever be given for Exams; if you are absent, please accept a zero.
- B. There are no make-ups for MiniQuizzes. (The lowest grade – or one missed quizz - will be dropped.)
- C. I fully expect all students to attend class and to participate fully in work done in class....in spite of the VERY early hour of this class. 10% of your final grade is allotted to this category and it all depends of YOU. In order to participate fully in class, homework assignments must be carefully completed PRIOR to the start of class each and every day. 15% of your final grade is allotted to this category....AND, AGAIN, IT ALL DEPENDS ON YOU AND YOU ALONE. YOU CONTROL 25% of your final grade....with discipline and a conscientious attitude. Attitude in this class is everything. Please note that homework submitted late is of no interest to me. Students should be prepared to spend between 5-10 hours per week for this class, outside of the classroom.....if you are not, ask yourself why?
- D. Three absences will be allowed. Attendance is always taken --- regardless of the reason for the absence or your presentation of a doctor's note. Please inform me (and the Office of Learning Services) if you have a chronic health problem. Should you experience a family tragedy in the course of this semester, (and we certainly hope not) the Dean's Office should be informed of your absence so that ALL your instructors will be "au courant". Beginning with the 4th absence, your oral participation grade will be lowered ½ letter grade for each class missed: a B will be changed to a B-, a C+ to a C, etc.
- E. Classroom procedures, rules and regulations: 1. Arrive on time. Late arrivals of more than 10 minutes will be counted as an absence. 2. Participate fully in class work. Attitude is everything. 3. Turn off all cell phones. You will be excused from class when your cell phone rings (and counted as absent) so that you may have full leisure to communicate at length with the person calling you with such an important message.

Thank you for your cooperation in these matters. You are ALWAYS welcome to speak with me after class. For your convenience and mine, the tables on the lower level of the library (near the Faculty Coffee Bar) will afford us an amicable setting. If these hours do not mesh with your schedule, I will be happy to meet with you at another time. Please know that I teach at another institution this semester, 1& 1/2 hours after this course is over.

You are always cordially invited to participate in La Table Française, each Thursday from noon to 12h45/ Amrhein Room in the HUB. This is a great way to earn a bit of extra credit, something that is difficult to come by on the college level.
