In order to participate well **homework assignments must be completed carefully before coming to class, even after an absence**. This work, including lab activities, constitutes **20% of the final grade**. Late homework assignments can be corrected but will not be graded. Students can expect to prepare for between 6-10 hours per week outside of class.
