To emphasize the importance of attendance and oral participation I have allotted 10% of the final grade to this aspect of the course. In order to participate well homework assignments must be completed carefully before coming to class, even after an absence. This work, including lab activities, constitutes 20% of the final grade.) Please note that homework submitted late, regardless of the reason, will be corrected but not graded. A small percentage of the homework grades will be dropped. Students can expect to prepare for between 6-10 hours per week outside of class.

- I allow three absences. Absences are counted, regardless of the reason for them or of your presentation of a doctor's note.
