#### **Course Goals:**

By the end of LAT 105 I hope that you will have a basic mastery of the elements of Latin grammar and vocabulary and, in addition, that you will be able to read simple Latin with a fair degree of fluency and accuracy. I also hope that you will be familiar with some of the main institutions and practices of Roman culture.
