Goal

Women in Music is a course that combines listening, history, and criticism. In addition to studying about women composers and artists of diverse cultural backgrounds throughout history, students will analyze and critique corresponding music. Analytical tools will be acquired while developing and improving skills in fundamental music reading and writing.

Textbooks

Required: New Historical Anthology of Music by Women Book and CD (Indiana University Press 2004) by James R. Briscoe

Recommended: Women in Music An Anthology of Source Readings from the Middle Ages to the Present (Northeastern University Press 1996) by Carol Neuls-Bates

Requirements
