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I. Course Description

This first course of the three-semester sequence Spanish series at Moravian College is designed to establish the basis of a life-long learning experience in the Spanish language. The class will be conducted mostly in Spanish. Students will achieve an “Intermediate low proficiency” upon completion of this introductory language program.

II. Course Objective: To assist the student in the acquisition of basic Spanish skills, primarily spoken Spanish.

The course is designed so that the student has ample time to use the language in class in a wide variety of settings, emphasizing practical language learning and real life situations and conversations. The student will learn basic grammar principles and a wide variety of grammar. The student will learn to write and read Spanish and will study the culture of different countries in the Spanish speaking world. The primary function and objective is to encourage the student to speak Spanish in class and outside of class and equip the student this first semester with the capability of speaking about self, family, interests, likes, etc. in the present tense. The student will also grasp basic knowledge of practical vocabulary such as numbers and time to assist in communication. By the end of the course, the student should be able to converse in Spanish with the professor.

III. Background Requirements: Students at this level are not expected to be familiar with basic Spanish vocabulary and/or to have a good grasp of most basic grammar concepts. If you are familiar with the language basics, the instructor may recommend you to move onto Spanish 105.

IV. Required Materials:

2. MySpanishLab Access Key to the electronic Students Activity Manual (SAM) to accompany the textbook ¡Arriba!

4. Blackboard. You must register and use the college Blackboard, to see daily announcements, your grades, etc.
5. Folder or notebook, with divisions, to keep the material well organized.
6. Assorted pencils and three-four colors of your choice (markers, crayons, etc).

V. Classroom Etiquette:

1. Treat the professor and other students with courtesy and respect.
2. Do not come to class more than 10 minutes late.
3. Raise your hand if you have a question.
4. Do not be persistently absent.
5. Personal matters should be handled in private and not in the classroom.
6. Turn cell phones off. You will be asked to leave the classroom if I notice you sending/receiving texts/phone calls.
7. Try to use the bathroom facilities before class whenever it is possible to avoid classroom disruptions.
8. Avoid chewing gum/eating during class sessions.
9. Come to class prepared (**expect to dedicate at least two hours of study outside of class for every hour of class time**).

B. Determining Components:

1. **Class participation (20%)** Twenty percent of your final grade will be based on class participation. Class participation is a vital part of your language-learning experience. You can improve your participation grade by (1) coming to class prepared and ready to participate on a regular basis; and (2) consistently interacting in Spanish with your professor and classmates. Making an effort will not only improve your grade but also make the class more fun.

Class participation grades will be weekly assigned as it follows:

- A (9-10) - participates actively in class and small group discussions, comes to class prepared and completes homework well; **often** volunteers answers and speaks with few mistakes.
- B (8) - participates actively in class and small group discussions; usually prepares homework well; **sometimes** volunteers; makes some mistakes with more advanced grammar concepts.
- C (7) - answers correctly when called upon; homework not always prepared well or on time; unsure of some basic grammar concepts; makes frequent mistakes with advanced grammar concepts.
- D (5-6) -not able to answer when called upon, homework poorly prepared or not at all; shows little interest in class; makes frequent mistakes with basic grammar concepts.-
- F (4-0) -shows no interest in speaking Spanish; does not prepare homework or discussion topics; rarely answers when called upon or repeatedly gives incorrect answers and makes frequent mistakes with basic grammar concepts.

Remember if you are in class but sleep in class, you are not in class, and if you are not in class, your class participation grade is F (0) for this day.

2. **Homework/ MySpanishLab (10%)** (<http://www.myspanishlab.com/>) activities are assigned on a daily basis and will have due dates as indicated on your electronic calendar at SAM (Students Activity Manual). There are also occasionally homework activities that will be assigned and collected for grading.

3. Quizzes will be given periodically. Some are listed on your tentative schedule but **pop quizzes may be given at any time**. They will count 20% towards your final grade.

4. Exams (20%) There will be four exams at the end of each chapter covering the Spanish culture, grammar, and vocabulary.

5. Final exam (10%) The final exam on support skills (culture, grammar, and vocabulary) will be comprehensive, it will cover Chapters 1-5; and will be similar in format to the previous exams.

6. Oral Exam (10%) The oral presentation will count as 10% of your final grade. The oral presentation will be 3-4 minutes long and incorporate themes being studied. The idea is to design an oral presentation that utilizes lesson elements and skills to the fullest extent possible. Each student will be expected to come to class fully prepared and **no note cards or notes** may be used.

7. Show and Tell (10%) Students search the web, select a country, a city and a newspaper and present the article read at a Spanish newspaper. Potential themes: news-politics, environment, business, education, art, entertainment, literature, music, weather, food, sports, etc. It must be a current event. Students must bring the actual name of the newspaper/source and date of the information (hard copy) obtained for a full credit. Possible sites to investigate:

VIII. Attendance Policy: Attendance is crucial for success in this course because a great portion of the learning will occur during class activities. Regular attendance is required to really learn the language.

Homework missed due to a justifiable absence (illness, death in the family, accident, field trips, etc.) may be made up **with appropriate documentation** (doctor's note, original medical invoice, death notice, copy of military orders, etc.) and instructor approval. **No credit will be awarded for missed assignments due to unjustifiable absences. No late homework will be accepted. Make-ups are not permitted for scheduled exams and quizzes unless you have appropriate documentation.** It is your responsibility to present this documentation to your instructor on the day you return from your absence. Documentation will not be accepted after one week.

***You may miss only two classes.** Any and all absences after the first two, regardless of the reason will require **proper written documentation to be presented no later than one week after the absence**; otherwise, your final grade will be lowered by 1% for each unexcused absence. **There are no make-ups for any unexcused absences. Late Arrivals will not be accepted** unless a good excuse is presented. Classes start and end on time. More than two late arrivals (10 or more minutes) or earlier dismissals will count as one absence.

IX. Academic Honesty at Moravian College: Plagiarism, cheating, helping or hindering others, false testimony, violations of copyright law, are unacceptable in the course.
