Course Description:

This first course of the three-semester sequence Spanish series at Moravian College is designed to establish the basis of a life-long learning experience in the Spanish language. The class will be conducted <u>mostly in Spanish</u>. Students will achieve an "Intermediate low proficiency" upon completion of this introductory language program. **Background Requirements:** Students at this level <u>are not expected</u> to be familiar with basic Spanish vocabulary and/or to have a good grasp of most basic grammar concepts. If you are familiar with the language basics, the instructor may recommend you to move up one level (Spanish 105).

Course Objective: To assist the student in the acquisition of basic Spanish skills, primarily spoken Spanish. The course is designed so that the student has ample time to use the language in class in a wide variety of settings, emphasizing practical language learning and real life situations and conversations. The student will learn basic grammar principles and a wide variety of grammar. The student will learn to write and read Spanish and will study the culture of different countries in the Spanish speaking world. The primary function and objective is to encourage the student to speak Spanish in class and outside of class and equip the student this first semester with the capability of speaking about self, family, interests, likes, etc. in the present tense. The student will also grasp basic knowledge of practical vocabulary such as numbers and time to assist in communication. By the end of the course, the student should be able to converse in Spanish with the professor.

Español 100 will focus on Lessons 1 - 5 of *¡Arriba! Comunicación y cultura* Students will be able to communicate about aspects of daily life in home, school, and community in conversation and in writing in the present tense.

Required Materials:

- 1. Zayas-Bazán, Eduardo and Susan M. Bacon, ¡Arriba! Comunicación y Cultura, 5th. Ed.
- 2. MySpanishLab Access Key to the electronic Students Activity Manual (SAM) to accompany the textbook ;Arriba!
- 3. Spanish-English/English-Spanish Dictionary
- 4. Blackboard. You must register and use the college Blackboard to check your progress report. Go to Blackboard and enroll in "Introductory Spanish I" Prof. Nilsa Lasso-von Lang
- 5. Folder or notebook, with divisions, to keep the material well organized.

Classroom Etiquette:

- 1. Treat the professor and other students with courtesy and respect.
- 2. Do not come to class more than 10 minutes late.
- 3. Raise your hand if you have a question.
- 4. Do not be persistently absent.
- 5. Personal matters should be handled in private and not in the classroom.
- 6. Turn cell phones off. You will be asked to leave the classroom if I notice you sending/receiving texts/phone calls.
- 7. Try to use the bathroom facilities before class whenever it is possible to avoid classroom disruptions.
- 8. Avoid chewing gum/eating during class sessions.
- 9. Come to class prepared (expect to dedicate at least two hours of study outside of class for every hour of class time).

Preparation: In order to develop the goals of the course, students will study the material assigned by the professor, with all the readings and activities in <u>Arriba! Comunicación y cultura</u> **before coming to class**. If a student misses class, it is his/her responsibility to find out the pages and complete activities assigned for the following class. Preparation for class includes writing, speaking, listening and reading. Writing should be done on a separate paper, not in the margins of your book. Write complete sentences whenever possible. Writing should be done neatly and kept in a loose-leaf notebook.

IMPORTANT NOTE: This will be a demanding course. Expect to spend about two hours outside class for every session. The good news is that you have excellent resources and by doing the work conscientiously, you will be speaking Spanish competently at an elementary level in no time. You will be using MySpanishLab Online Resources. This is a nationally hosted online learning system created for students in college-level language courses. It includes a wide array of language-learning tools and resources: interactive version of the ¡Arriba! Student Activities Manual, an electronic version of the ¡Arriba! Student text, and all materials from the ¡Arriba! Audio and video programs, Readiness checks, chapter tests/practices and tutorials. Instructors can use this system to make assignments, post announcements, set grading parameters, listen to student-created audio recordings, e-mail students, collect and keep scores of graded exercises, assignments and tests, and provide feedback on student work. Students will need to use a Student Access Code to access MySpanishLab – this access code is included in your package and you will be able to access this online learning system from any computer. (See instructions on how to register in your MySpanishLab course). Your Section ID is CRSCD7L-606671.

Class attendance: Faithful attendance is expected, since continuous practice is needed in order to learn a language. The learning of a language is a cumulative process, and it is not easy to make up for several missed classes.

Class participation (25%): Students are expected to come to class having prepared ALL materials assigned by the professor. In class, students <u>must participate actively</u> speaking in group activities and class discussions. Missing class lowers the participation grade.

Active Participation in class will be graded as follows:

- **A=95** *Excellent participation* (the student answers questions and offers interesting comments without the need of the professor or the debate leader calling on him/her. The comments and answers show that the student prepared, completed and understood the assignment.
- **B=85** *Good participation* (the student answers questions and offers interesting comments whenever the professor or debate leader calls on him/her. Sometimes, the student participates without being asked. The comments and answers show that the student has prepared and understood the assignment.
- **C=75** *Fair participation* (the student answers questions and offers comments only when the professor or debate leader calls on him/her. The comments and answers show that the student has prepared or attempted to complete the assignment, but doesn't seem to understand it.
- **D=65** *Poor participation* (the student answers questions and offers very brief comments only when the professor or debate leader calls on him/her. The comments and answers show lack of interest and/or a poor preparation.
- **F=55** *Lack of participation* (the student does not answer questions and does not offer any comments in the class or group discussion. The lack of comments and answers as well as incorrect answers, show that the student has not completed the assignment or, if he/she has done it, it has been in a careless or incomplete way).
- **Tests/Pruebas** (20%): There will be 2 tests and a **final exam** (20%). The final exam will be comprehensive and will be divided into two major parts: Part 1- oral interviews, and Part II grammar, writing, reading, culture and comprehension (20%). Unauthorized absence from the tests or the final exam will result in a grade of zero for that test or exam. **Quizzes** (15%): There will be a vocabulary quiz part way through each chapter (except for chapter 5). Make-ups will only be given if students inform the professor of the reason for the absence **before** the exam and quizzes are given in class by calling (or having someone call) or sending an E-mail message. The make-up will be given at the professor's discretion.

Homework (10%): You must go to **MySpanishLab.com** to access your homework assignment (check Announcements daily). Your assignments can be completed online and scores will be collected by your instructor. **Please pay attention to deadlines**. See calendar below for specific assignments.

Show and Tell (10%) Students will give a short presentation (in English or Spanish) as "show and tell" at least once during the semester. Instructor will provide a list of possible topics. Potential themes: news-politics, environment, business, education, art, literature, music, food, sports, places of interest, personal experience, etc. It must be a current **Hispanic event**. Students must do research, bring an outline and the actual name of the sources and date of the information (hard copy) obtained for a full credit. Duration: 5-8 minutes.

"Otras cosas": You are encouraged to use every opportunity to hear and speak Spanish. Practice with each other outside class. Plan to spend 20 minutes or half an hour each day listening to Spanish radio or watching Spanish TV. Participate in the weekly Spanish table as much as possible. You can also benefit from "chatting" rooms in Spanish or pen pal activities. Find a partner whose native language is Spanish and practice what you learn. Such activities will enhance your performance in class and help you get more out of the course.

Academic integrity: academic dishonesty, that is, **cheating** on tests and exams, and **plagiarism** (using another person's words and passing them off as your own) is a serious offense and will be handled according to the Moravian policy on Academic Honesty (please, see the *Student Handbook*). It is your responsibility to avoid dishonest behavior. In addition, be advised that improper use of the dictionary or use of online translating services for written assignments will result in a grade of zero. Disrespectful behavior won't be tolerated. BE HONEST AND RESPECTFUL!
