- ❖ I fully expect all students to attend class and to participate in work done in class. To emphasize the importance of attendance and oral participation I have allotted 20% of the final grade to attendance and preparation for class. In order to participate well homework assignments must be completed carefully and thoughtfully before coming to class.
- ❖ You are entitled to **three absences** that will not adversely affect your grade. All absences count as an absence, even those for which a doctor's note is available. Therefore, it is best to 1) not schedule doctor's visits during class, and 2) save up your three available absences for when you are sick. The student's final attendance grade (5%) is computed as follows: 0-1 absence = A+ / 2-3 = A / 4 = B- / 5 = C- / 6 = D- / 7 = -2.5 / 8 = -3 / 9 = -3.5 / 10 = -4 / 11 = -4.5 / 12 or more = -5 (To be clear, every time you miss class counts as an absence, even if you have a doctor's note.)

CLASSROOM ENVIRONMENT

In order to have a **good learning environment** in class I ask that the following conditions be respected:

Arrive in class on time. Repeated late arrivals will be reflected in a lowered class participation grade. Late arrivals of more than 15 minutes will be counted as an absence.

Participate fully in class work. Unsatisfactory classroom behavior, such as little or no verbal response, uncooperative interaction with others for group work and/or a disrespectful attitude will be reflected in a lowered class participation grade.
