Course Description:

Continuing of German 100, introduction and practice of elements of language structures in the classroom through oral and written exercises as well as class participation and homework assignments. Reading, writing, listening and speaking the language will be taught and practiced throughout the course. Prerequisite: passing grade in German 100 or placement through the Foreign Language Department.

Objectives:

Designed to develop novice-mid to novice-high proficiency in the German language as it is spoken and written today. Students will have the opportunity to communicate in concrete situations, engage in basic conversations, master the basic features of the sound and writing systems and utilize a basic vocabulary. This course will also cover an introduction to contemporary life and culture in the German speaking countries.
