Course Description (*from Course Catalog*): Problems of organizing and managing data for use by managers, economists, and social scientists, or anyone who must keep track of information. Basics of information systems: what they are, how to design them, how they are used; and two computer tools used to manage them: spreadsheets and databases. Web research and usage.

- 2. Learn how Excel is used in the business environment and how to use it effectively in management
- 3. Learn how Access is used in the business environment and how to use it effectively in management
- 4. Know when to use spreadsheets and databases to aid in problem solving
- 5. Learn how and when it is more important to know where/how to find the answer to the problem rather than how to answer the problem
