Course Description & Objectives: The purpose of this course is for Emerging Leader Scholarship recipients to come together with a facilitator to learn leadership themes, create opportunities to lead and have an impact, and find their place in the College community as aspiring leaders on campus and beyond.

We will meet together on a weekly basis (there will be additional times outside of our Monday class that we will meet and/or that student sub-groups will meet). The semester will consist of in-class discussions, thoughtful writing projects, planning and organizational activities, and exploration of students' purpose and identity.

Required Readings: These will be provided by the instructor throughout the semester.
