GOALS

To perform the highest quality band literature from the 17th through the 21st centuries. This spring semester's schedule will include two band concerts in Foy that will be live-streamed, an inauguration ceremony, and (for those able to attend) a commencement ceremony.

ATTENDANCE AND GRADING

1. Since listening and balance are learned by playing together, all rehearsals and concerts are required.
2. If you have another class, a team sport, work, or student teaching assignment that prevents you from arriving on time, please discuss this with Mr. Barnes at the beginning of the term (or at the commencement of each student teaching assignment).
3. Three or more excused and/or unexcused absences may result in removal from the ensemble and/or a redistribution of your part. If you have a required event during one of our concerts, please request the professor provide alternative assignments.
4. Rehearsals are from 4-6 pm. Playing begins at 4:05 and ends at 5:55 thus allowing 5 minutes to retrieve and return instruments and music.
5. For unforeseen conflicts, please text Mr. Barnes, as soon as possible.
6. If you are absent from rehearsal, please make sure your music is accessible by the band – especially if you have solo parts. If you lose your music, you will be charged to replace the parts.

PRACTICE AND GENERAL COMMENTS

7. Each member should contribute to the ensemble by practicing the Wind Ensemble music outside rehearsals 20-30 minutes a day, or approximately 2.5 hours per week.
8. Merely playing rhythms and notes is not making music. Special attention and concentration should be placed on emotion, intonation, tone quality, balance, dynamics and stylistic interpretation.
