**Course Description:** Civil Liberties of Americans are delineated in the Bill of Rights. This course will examine issues of Freedom of Speech, Assembly & the Press; Freedom of Religion; right to counsel, right against self incrimination, right to be free from warrantless searches and seizures; right to a fair trial, right to privacy and equal protection. We will also explore the power and role of both the Congress and the Judiciary with respect to enforcing, upholding and defining civil liberties.

## **Course Requirements:**

(1) There will be two quizzes, one midterm paper and one final examination. The dates of these quizzes, papers, and exams are listed in the class schedule. The college will determine the date of the final examination. The final examination will be cumulative.

(2) Each student will be required to find a current event in the newspapers, Internet or other written media, which pertains to a civil liberty. The student will be required to hand in a copy of the article along with a brief written analysis of the article. Each student will also be required to present the article to the class. This assignment will be graded.
