

Nursing 331.2: Pharmacology I

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Office: Hamilton Hall (first floor)

Course Description:

This nursing course examines the pharmacological process utilized by nurses including knowledge of medications, administration of medications, and medication calculations in patients throughout the lifespan. Pharmacological issues, over the counter medications, and herbal medication use will be examined. Reactions, side effects, adherence, and other patient responses to pharmacological therapies will be discussed. This course will build on prior nursing knowledge and current required nursing courses.

Course Objectives:

- 1. Examine the pharmacological process utilized in the safe administration of medications to client.
- 2. Explore pharmacological issues related to client care.
- 3. Analyze ethical and legal principles associated with medication administration.

Please note that it is within the instructor's purview to apply qualitative judgment in determining grades for evaluation and for the final course grade.

Examinations:

Eight quizzes, five examinations and a cumulative final examination will be administered. Quizzes and examination will be administered at the beginning of class. Students will be allotted 20 minutes to complete each quiz, 50 minutes to complete each exam and the entire scheduled time to complete the final exam. Students who are late for a quiz or examination will not be allotted additional time.

Course Requirements:

- 1. Classes will begin promptly at their assigned times.
- 2. Students are expected to attend class.
- 3. Classes may consist of group work, assignments, and quizzes or exams that will count toward students' course grades. Students are expected to review assigned concepts prior to class in preparation for class.
- 4. Students who experience course-related difficulty should consult the course faculty in a timely and constructive manner.
- 5. Students must refrain from texting, e-messaging, emailing and talking amongst one another during class.
- 6. Academic honesty in all course-related assignments is an expectation of the course faculty. Academic dishonesty includes but is not limited to cheating on exams. Students who are found cheating on a quiz or examination will receive a zero for the quiz or examination. It will be assumed that students who text or use smart/cell phones during exams are cheating. For this reason, students will place all of their personal belongings, including cell phones, against the outer walls of the classroom and away from the testing seats during exams. In addition, students found cheating will be disciplined in accordance with policies outlined in the Moravian College Student Handbook.
- 7. If a student is unable to take the exam, the student must notify the instructor, via the instructor's office phone, at least one hour before a quiz or examination is scheduled to begin or the student will receive a zero for that day's quiz or examination. Generally, valid excuses for missing a quiz or exam include a documented personal illness (from a licensed healthcare provider) or family emergency.

- 8. Students who arrive late for a quiz or examination <u>and</u> who have not contacted the instructor at least one hour beforehand will not receive additional time to complete that day's quiz or examination.
- 9. Students who need to make up a quiz or examination will receive an alternative quiz or examination at the instructor's discretion. Make-up quizzes or examinations must be completed before the next scheduled class.
- 10. Students have <u>72 hours</u> from the end of class on the day of a quiz or exam, to notify the instructor should they wish to review a quiz or examination.
- 11. Students may not copy or photograph quizzes or exams.
- 12. Students may not discuss the content of a quiz or exam with students who has not taken the quiz or exam.
- 13. The use of recording devices is at the discretion of the instructor.
- 14. Written assignments must be printed and given to the instructor in person by the end of class. Electronic copies will not be accepted.
- 15. Late assignments will receive a 10 point deduction for every day past the due date. The deduction will be applied each day at 5:00 PM past the date and time due. Late assignments must be printed and given to the instructor in person or handed in at the nursing office. Electronic copies will not be accepted.
- 16. Students who wish to request accommodations in this class for a disability must contact the Academic Support Center located on the first floor of Monocacy Hall (extension 1401). Accommodations cannot be provided until authorization is received from the Academic Support Center.
- 17. Students who require accommodations will take quizzes or exams immediately prior to or after class. The Moravian College nursing program is accredited by the Commission on Collegiate Nursing Education. As part of the accreditation process the program must provide evidence of assignments completed by students. Any of the methods of evaluation used in this course, may be used as evidence of student assignments during the accreditation process.
