Course Description

"The Moravian Ethics Bowl Team is made up of five undergraduate students, although more can participate. They meet and practice weekly, discussing the ethical cases provided by the Ethics Bowl Executive Board. Upon receiving the cases for the given year's Regional competition, each team member investigates the ethics that line both sides of a given case. The Team prepares its arguments and possible rebuttals for each of the cases to prepare for competition at the Regional IEB."

- Develop and articulate arguments.
- Express their views and justification clearly and intelligibly.
- Discern ethical issues.
- Discern ethically relevant and irrelevant issues.
- Discern the various ethical perspectives and viewpoints.
