## Purpose of the Course

The purpose of this course is to provide students with the skills and strategies necessary to incorporate musical elements into their elementary teaching practices. This course will also challenge students to develop a rationale for integrating music with their general elementary curriculum.

# **Course Objectives**

- 1. Students will develop the skills and strategies necessary to incorporate musical elements in their elementary classrooms through readings, classroom discussions, and whole group, small group, and individual projects/performances.
- 2. Students will develop the skills to teach and write songs/raps through listening, singing, and rote memorization.
- 3. Students will demonstrate their abilities to play rhythms individually and in ensembles by tapping, clapping, and playing rhythm instruments.
- 4. Students will demonstrate their abilities to read simple melodic notation by playing melodic instruments and singing.
- 5. Students will compile a journal of musical activities.
- 6. Students will begin to develop a rudimentary musical lexicon.
- 7. Students will develop an appreciation for the value of music and the creative arts in education.

#### Course Procedures

**ATTENDANCE AND PARTICIPATION**: To be successful in this class, punctual attendance and active participation are crucial. Because this class is structured in a systematic manner, much of the material covered will not come from lectures, but from small-group and whole-group presentations. If you have a valid reason why you cannot attend a class, please call or e-mail me by 12:00 noon on that day. If at all possible, please send completed homework (if you have a hard copy) with a classmate or upload it to the Google drive as not to lose points. You must then ask class members to let you know what you missed. You must also obtain copies of any handouts that were distributed. Ten points will be taken off your grade for each class you miss.
