Course Description: This course provides an introduction to the elements of business enterprises and the society in which they operate. Marketing and Branding, Productions, Operations and Information Systems and Human Resources will be introduced and contemporary issues explored. The Social/Cultural, Legal/Political, Technological and Economic environment of business will be examined. The interplay of the values of the U.S. and other nations in a rapidly globalizing environment where all nations are threatened by global ecological crisis will be examined. The essential role of government in subsidizing and regulating business, while permitting adequate latitude and incentives for entrepreneurial behavior, will be considered.
