Objectives

- To improve student's ability to identify and apply specific melodic and harmonic elements within the iazz idiom.
- ◆ Specific areas of attention include: <u>identification of chord qualities</u> (Maj 7, min7, dominant 7, etc.) and their alterations (b5, #5, etc.), extensions (9, 11, 13), or altered extensions (b9, #9, #11, b13); <u>arpeggios of said chords, chord progressions</u> (I-vi-ii-V-I "the turnaround" and its alterations and substitutions, ii-V-I and tritone substitutions, etc.); and recognition of chord qualities.
- To transcribe an improvised solo, agreed upon by teacher and pupil mutually, from a recording with the intention of improving and applying student's practical aural skills.

Requirements

- Student is required to attend each scheduled class promptly. Excessive absence without proper notification can not be tolerated.
- Student is required to be fully prepared for each class based on given assignments from instructor.
- Student is expected to show that an effort to improve and assimilate lesson material has been made regardless of immediate results.

• No specific text has been assigned with the exception of a book of music paper (manuscript) which will be used extensively.
