The goal of this seminar is to examine, analyze, and discuss music of political protest with particular emphasis on banned and controversial works. These works include *Le Roman de Fauvel* and Dmitri Shostakovich's *The Nose*. The life and works of Leonard Bernstein, focusing on politics, will be studied. Multimedia works and diverse musical genres, such as jazz and musical theater, will also be explored. Public student multimedia presentations of chosen individual topics will be the culminating experience.
