Course Description:

This course provides students with a framework to guide advanced clinical inquiry. Students learn how to formulate researchable and clinically relevant evidence-based practice (EBP) questions, perform advanced literature searches, and critique the strength of current evidence. Students identify and propose EBP projects that are relevant to their specialty areas.

Course Objectives:

At the conclusion of this course, the student will be able to:

- 1. Analyze organizational culture and structures that promote evidence-based practice.
- 2. Evaluate research findings from nursing and other disciplines as a basis for assuring best practices.
- 3. Apply health research methods and processes alone or in partnership to impact nursing practice, education, or administration.
- 4. Develop an evidence-based project proposal that is significant for the MSN student's desired role as an Adult-Gerontology Acute Care Nurse Practitioner, Adult-Gerontology Primary Care Nurse Practitioner, Clinical Nurse Leader, Nurse Administrator, or Nurse Educator.
